壹、依據

一、依據本市金竹獎府教學字第1120040617號及本校英語教學活動計畫。

貳、目的

一、促進學童英文素養的學習，發掘其英語潛能。

二、培養學童英文溝通素養，以達適性揚才。

三、增進學生自發、互動及共好的素養。

參、主辦單位：教務處、英語老師團隊、本校外籍教師

肆、競賽辦法

一、參賽對象：三至五年級學生，分為中年級及高年級兩組。

二、比賽文章：中高年級組各指定篇目一篇，請詳見附件三、四。

三、比賽時間：每位選手1分鐘為限。

四、比賽日期及場地：

五、實施方式：

1. 中高年級各班由英文任課老師推薦選手參與(依據孩子英文課堂的學習態度及學習表現推薦選手)，並填妥各班選手推薦表(附件一)後，由各班英語老師繳交至教務處課發組(分機723 張老師)。各班以1名為原則，若無適合選手得從缺。
2. 班級推薦時間從即日起至3/24(五)截止，後續將公告選手名單與序號。
3. 由本校兩位外籍老師及一位中師擔任評審，特優代表學校參加新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽(112年6月3日於虎林國中辦理)。

六、評分標準：

七、注意事項：

1. 若有曾參與金竹獎市賽獲得特優或優等名次的學生，得由該班英語老師另遞推薦表(需檢附得獎證明影本)，得增額參加校內初選，不受每班1名選手之限。
2. 請各班選手於比賽時間前十分鐘報到完畢。
3. 上台前4分鐘聽到叫號後於預備處領稿，進行準備。

4. 聽聞上台叫號後計時開始，選手定位後直接開始朗讀篇目與文章內容，不做自我介紹及開場。
5. 朗讀時間以1分鐘為限，鈴響後立即結束朗讀下台。
6. 不使用譜架，手拿稿，不背稿。
7. 本辦法經奉核後實施，修正時亦同。

伍、獎勵：

- 一、擇優錄取各組特優二名及優等三名頒發獎狀乙紙，並於校內公開表揚。
- 二、每組錄取二名特優選手須代表本校參與新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽。
