## 壹、依據

一、依據本市金竹獎教學字第 1130020056 號及本校英語教學活動計畫。

## 貳、目的

- 一、促進學童英文素養的學習，發掘其英語潛能。
- 二、培養學童英文溝通素養，以達適性揚才。
- 三、增進學生自發、互動及共好的素養。

## 肆、實施辦法

- 一、參賽對象：三至六年級學生，分為中年級及高年級兩組。
- 二、比賽文章：中年級及高年級組各指定篇目一篇，請詳見附件三、四。
- 三、比賽時間：每位選手 1 分鐘為限。
- 四、比賽日期及場地：

## 伍、實施方式：

1. 中高年級組由各班任課英文老師推薦適合選手參與(依據孩子英文課堂的學習態度及學習表現推薦選手)，並填妥各班選手推薦表(附件一)後，由各班英語老師繳交至教務處課務組(分機 722 劉組長)。各班以 1 名為原則，若無適合選手得從缺。
2. 班級推薦時間自即日起至 3/22(五)截止，後續將公告選手名單與序號於校網。
3. 由本校外籍教師及中師擔任評審，特優代表學校參加新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽(113 年 6 月 1 日於虎林國中辦理)。

## 柒、注意事項：

1. 若有曾參與金竹獎市賽獲得特優或優等名次的學生，得由該班英語老師另遞推薦表(需檢附得獎證明影本)得增額錄取參加校內初選，不受每班一人選手之限。
2. 請各班選手於比賽時間前十分鐘報到完畢。
3. 上台前 4 分鐘聽到叫號後於預備處領稿，進行準備。
4. 聽聞叫號後上台，選手定位後直接開始朗讀篇目與文章內容，  
不做自我介紹及開場。(自聲音發出時開始計時，鈴響立即結束朗讀。)
5. 朗讀時間以 1 分鐘為限，鈴響後立即結束朗讀下台。
6. 參賽學生須持稿朗讀，無需背誦，亦不得攜帶道具
7. 本辦法經奉核後實施，修正時亦同。

## 捌、獎勵：

1. 擇優錄取各組特優二名及優等三名頒發獎狀乙紙，並於校內公開表揚。
2. 每組錄取二名特優選手須代表本校參與新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽。
