壹、依據

一、依據本市金竹獎公文府教學字第 1140032316 號和 113 學年度提升師生口說英語展能樂學計畫辦理校內初選。

貳、目的

- 一、促進學童英文素養的學習，發掘其英語潛能。
- 二、培養學童英文溝通素養，以達適性揚才。
- 三、增進學生自發、互動及共好的素養。

參、主辦單位：教務處、英語領域老師

肆、實施辦法

- 一、參賽對象：三至六年級學生，分為中年級及高年級兩組。
- 二、比賽文章：中年級及高年級組各指定篇目一篇，請詳見附件二、三。
- 三、比賽時間：每位選手 1 分鐘為限。
- 四、比賽日期及場地：

伍、實施方式：

1. 中、高年級組由各班任課英語老師推薦適合選手參與(依據孩子英語課堂的學習態度及學習表現推薦選手)，填妥各班選手推薦表(附件一)後，由各班英語老師繳交至教務處課務組。各班以1名為原則，若無適合選手得從缺。
2. 班級推薦時間自即日起至3/14(五)截止，後續將公告選手名單與序號於校網。
3. 由本校外籍教師及中師擔任評審，各組二名特優選手將代表學校參加新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽(114年5月24日於虎林國中辦理)。

陸、評分標準(參照金竹獎比賽辦法)：

柒、注意事項：

1. 若曾參與金竹獎市賽獲得特優或優等名次的學生，得由該班英語老師另遞推薦表(需檢附得獎證明影本)，得增額錄取參加校內初選，不受每班一人選手之限。
2. 請各班選手於比賽時間前十分鐘報到完畢。
3. 上台前4分鐘聽到叫號後，於預備處領稿進行準備。
4. 聽聞叫號後上台，選手定位後，直接開始朗讀篇目與文章內容，不做自我介紹及開場。朗讀時間以1分鐘為限，自聲音發出時開始計時，鈴響後立即結束朗讀下台。
5. 參賽學生持稿朗讀，無需背誦，亦不得攜帶道具。
6. 本辦法經奉核後實施，修正時亦同。

捌、獎勵：

1. 擇優錄取各組特優二名及優等三名頒發獎狀乙紙，並於校內公開表揚。
2. 各組錄取之二名特優選手，代表本校參加新竹市金竹獎朗讀比賽。
